- 2. Nominations are only accepted from FHLB Des Moines member institutions.
- 3. There is no maximum number of nominations a member may submit.
- 4. The Strong Communities Award provides a \$15,000 award to one rural winner and one urban winner. One runner-up in each category will receive \$3,000.
- 5. Nominees may be individuals, public agencies, for-profit and/or not-for-profit organizations. The award may only be payable to the project or an economic development organization.
- 6. Nominations should include this nomination form plus appropriate supplementary documents. Photos and video are encouraged. Please limit the complete application and supplementary documents to no more than ten pages.
- 7. Award announcements will be made in October 2016.
